Oxford & Rome Summer 2010 Programs

The theme of the 2010 Oxford Summer Programme in Theology is "Faith In Action." The dates are July 25-31 (week one) and August 1-7 (week two). Students of the Foundation may earn Units of Study by attending either or both weeks. This program is hosted at Christ Church College, Oxford, one of the oldest colleges of Oxford University, and is under the direction of the Oxford University Department for Continuing Education (OUDCE).

The 2010 Rome Summer Course will be an "Introduction to the Ecumenical & Inter-Religious Movements from a Roman Catholic Perspective." The dates are June 21 - July 9, and students may attend one, two or all three weeks of the course and apply Units of Study toward a degree at the Foundation. This course is hosted at the Centro Pro Unione near the Piazza Navona in the heart of Rome. Applications are now being accepted, and the deadline to apply is March 31, 2010. Graduation Ceremony 2010

Preparations are well underway for the 2010 Graduation on Friday, May 7. Prior to this momentous occasion, the Archbishop Robert Runcie Convocation Lecture will be presented the evening of Thursday, May 6. Delivering the lecture will be The Very Reverend John Moses, Emeritus Dean of St. Paul's Cathedral in London. A graduate of Nottingham University and Trinity Hall, Cambridge, Moses trained at Lincoln Theological College, where he was ordained in 1964. After serving in a variety of parochial assignments as a priest in the Church of England, he became Provost of Chelmsford before taking over as Dean of St. Paul's Cathedral in London in 1996. He has published a number of books including *The Sacrifice of God: A Holistic Theory of Atonement* (Canterbury Press, 1994) and *A Broad and Living Way: Church and State: A Continuing Establishment* (Canterbury Press, 1995). In 1992 he was appointed the first Rector of Anglia Ruskin University in England and was, subsequent to his retiring from St. Paul's Cathedral as Dean, made a Knight Commander of the Royal Victorian Order by Queen Elizabeth II. A social hour will follow.

During the graduation ceremony on May 7, The Very Reverend John Moses will be inducted as an Honorary Fellow of the Foundation and will be granted the Doctor of Divinity *honoris causa*.

The Graduation Address will be given by Mr. Chris Day, Director of Academic Programmes in the International Programmes Division of the Oxford University Department for Continuing Education, and he will be inducted as an Honorary Fellow.

The Revd. Professor Robin Gibbons of Oxford University will be inducted as a Fellow of the Foundation. Dr. Gibbons is Director of Theology and Religious Studies Programmes at the Oxford University Department for Continuing Education and Associate Director of the Oxford Summer Programme in Theology.

Rabbi David H. Aaron, Professor of Hebrew Bible and History of Interpretation at the Hebrew Union College of Cincinnati, will receive the Krister Stendahl Medal for Biblical Studies and will be inducted as an Honorary Fellow of the Foundation.

Ms. Kim Ferraro, Esq., Executive Director of the Legal Environmental Aid Foundation of Indiana, Inc., will receive the Cloverdale College Community Service Award.

Krister Stendahl Medal

The Krister Stendahl Medal in Biblical Studies was inaugurated in 2009 in recognition of Dr. Stendahl's

outstanding contribution to biblical studies and in appreciation of his early involvement and enthusiastic interest in the work and mission of the Foundation's commitment to religious pluralism.

Each year, the medal is awarded to an outstanding scholar in the field of biblical studies. This year, the medal will be awarded to Rabbi Dr. David Aaron, Professor of Hebrew Bible & History of Interpretation at Hebrew Union College-Jewish Institute of Religion (HUC-JIR) in Cincinnati, Ohio. His most recent published work is *Etched in Stone: The Origin of the Decalogue Traditions* (T & T Clark 2006). Dr. Aaron will be presented with the Stendahl Medal during the Foundation's graduation ceremony on May 7.

Krister Stendahl (b. 1921, d. 2008) was a Swedish theologian and New Testament scholar, Emeritus Lutheran Bishop of Stockholm and Professor Emeritus of Harvard Divinity School. He was also the second director of the Center for Religious Pluralism at the Shalom Hartman Institute in Jerusalem.

C.O.R.E. Programs in Ghana and Michigan

The College Out Reach Education (C.O.R.E.) program is an initiative of Cloverdale College to provide an opportunity for doctoral degree graduates of the Foundation to offer courses within their own faith communities which can be applied toward the Bachelor of Religious Education degree. The C.O.R.E. program is now offered through faith communities in Accra, Ghana, and Auburn Hills, Michigan, with a curriculum designed and taught by doctoral graduates of the Graduate Theological Foundation.

Rev. Paul Hometowu is Professor of Religious Education in the CORE faculty of Cloverdale College. He holds a M.A. in Pastoral Counseling from Fordham University and a Doctor of Ministry degree with a concentration in Pastoral Counseling from the Graduate Theological Foundation. Dr. Hometowu offers CORE program courses to his faith community at St. Michael's Catholic Church in Accra, Ghana in West Africa.

Nancy Mason Bordley is Professor of Religious Education in the CORE faculty of Cloverdale College. She received a Doctor of Ministry from the Graduate Theological Foundation, a M.A. in Pastoral Studies from Sts. Cyril and Methodius Seminary and a B.A. in Religious Education from St. Mary's College in Orchard Lake, Michigan. Dr. Bordley offers CORE program courses to her faith community at St. John Fisher University Chapel Parish in Auburn Hills, Michigan, outside of Detroit.

Special Faculty Appointment

The Foundation is pleased to announce the appointment of Dr. Esmail Koushanpour as Distinguished Service Professor in American Muslim Relations. He is currently also Advisor to the President on Islamic Affairs. In 2007, he was awarded the Doctor of Humane Letters *honoris causa* by the Foundation for his years of service to the various faith communities in the U.S. and his advocacy work as a professor and humanitarian.

Dr. Koushanpour is Executive Director of the Islamic Cultural Center of Greater Chicago and Emeritus Professor of the medical school at Northwestern University. He was a Fulbright Scholar at the

University of Heidelberg in Germany and has also served as co-Chairman of the Council of Islamic Organizations' Catholic-Muslim Dialogue Committee. In addition, he has been honored by the Richard H. Driehaus Foundation with the Faith In Community Award for building bridges between faiths. Rev. Shinichi Tagami, Visiting Professor of Psychology and Counseling. He graduated from Kwansai Gakuin University, Hyogo, Japan, with a B.Th. and from Japan Bible Seminary, Tokyo, Japan, with a M.Div. equivalent degree. After his pastoral ministry in Okinawa, Japan, and ordination as a Baptist minister, Dr. Tagami pursued his graduate studies at Fuller Theological Seminary, School of World Mission, and Biola University, Talbot School of Theology in California, to receive a Th.M. and a Ed.D. In 2009, Dr. Tagami earned a Ph.D. from the Graduate Theological Foundation. Dr. Tagami started the Christian Society of Mental-Pscho-Spiritual Care in Japan (MPSC) at Mt. Olive Hospital, Okinawa, Japan, together with Christian psychiatrists, neurosurgeons, and scholars in related fields.

Monsignor Richard M. Zborowski, Visiting Professor of Clinical Psychology. He is a Roman Catholic priest in the Archdiocese of Chicago, currently serving as a pastor at St. Theresa Church in Palatine, Illinois. Msgr. Zborowski is a graduate of

Loyola University where he received his B.A. in English Literature. He continued his studies at the archdiocesan seminary in Mundelein, Illinois, where he received his M.Div. In the 1980's, Msgr. Zborowski studied at The Adler Institute of Chicago where he received his M.A. in counseling psychology. He was part of the committee that introduced the Psy.D. to the now Adler School of Professional Psychology where he received his Psy.D. in Clinical Psychology.
