Finding Religion in Oxford: Spirituality and Liturgy

December 12-December 19, 2007

The Oxford Winter Institute (OWI) is co-sponsored by the Oxford University Department for Continuing Education and the Graduate Theological Foundation. It will be hosted on the campus of Jesus College, Oxford University. The topic of the OWI will be Liturgy and Spirituality. Certificates of completion will be awarded to students by the Oxford University Department for Continuing Education. Students of the Foundation will be able to earn 2 Units of Study (or 6 graduate credits) toward any degree offered by the Graduate Theological Foundation.

The OWI will consist of one morning seminar and one afternoon seminar, with a mid-week plenary lecture delivered by an Oxford University scholar. The Director of the Oxford Winter Institute and Principal Tutor is The Rev. Dr. Robin Gibbons who will lead the Liturgy section of the Institute. He is Programme Director and Lecturer in Theology and Religious Studies in the Oxford University Department for Continuing Education and, for the Foundation, serves as Dean of Studies, Foundation House/Oxford, and as the Alexander Schmemmann Professor of Eastern Christianity. The Tutor for the Spirituality section is to be announced. Canon Vincent Strudwick will deliver the Plenary Lecture, with topic to be announced. He is Honorary Canon of Christ Church Cathedral, Oxford, Honorary Fellow and Chamberlain of Kellogg College, Oxford, and, at the Foundation, serves as Bishop John Tinsley Professor of Anglican Theology.

Running from Wednesday to Wednesday (Dec. 12-19), the Oxford Winter Institute on the campus of Jesus College will host a social and orientation for students on the first Wednesday evening. (Students depart the following Wednesday.) Students will be in residence at Jesus College, where they will also attend both Institute seminars.

Expanding Sacred Music Program

The Rev. Dr. Peter Roussakis, the Charles Wesley Professor of Sacred Music, has announced his retirement from his role as Director of Sacred Music at the Foundation but will continue his professorship. The Foundation is grateful for his ten years of leadership in sacred music, and the labor he has expended in building this program constitutes the foundation upon which the newly expanded sacred music program is being built. The Foundation is announcing the appointment of additional faculty to the position of Professor of Sacred Music. Expanded venues of training and study are available both on-site and through the use of the E-Tutorial option.

The Foundation is pleased to announce the appointment of the following four Professors of Sacred Music:

Dr. Vivian Dettbarn is on the music faculty at the University of Findlay. She holds a Bachelor's degree in Piano from the University of California at Santa Barbara, a Master's degree in Music Education with vocal emphasis from the Appalachian State University, and earned her Doctor of Sacred Music degree from the

Foundation in 2001 followed by postdoctoral work in vocal performance and music history at Memphis State University. Dr. Dettbarn was music department chair at Adrian College in Michigan, where she taught applied music, music history, and honors courses dealing with music and society. She has taught at Appalachian State University, where she was assistant director of the university chorale. While doing graduate work at Memphis State University, she was a vocal coach in the opera department and taught applied music. Most recently, she served as the Director of Music Ministries and organist for the Adrian Dominican Sisters in Michigan. She has also served several churches in California, Tennessee and North Carolina. She has performed with orchestras, opera companies and in recital as a singer, chamber musician and pianist in the United States, Canada and Europe. Dr. Dettbarn is a member of the National Association of Teachers of Singing and the National Association of Pastoral Musicians. Her music is published by Alliance Publications, Inc.

Dr. Martha Sobaje is Minister of Music and Education at Phillips Memorial Baptist Church in Cranston, Rhode Island, and Adjunct Instructor of Music at both Community College of Rhode Island and Bristol Community College in Massachusetts. She previously held faculty positions at University of Northern Colorado, Barrington College, and Gordon College. She holds a Bachelor of Music degree from the University of the Pacific in Stockton, California, the Master of Music degree from the Eastman School of Music in Rochester, New York, and the Doctor of Sacred Music from the Graduate Theological Foundation. Dr. Sobaje attended the Summer Programme in Theology at Christ Church College of Oxford University in 2001. She is a member of the American Society of Composers, Authors and Publishers (ASCAP), and her choral, handbell, and organ compositions are published through many companies, including Kendor Music, Almitra Music, Elkan-Vogel, Music 70 and Studio PR, among others. In addition to workshops and conferences around the country, Dr. Sobaje has performed organ recitals at the

University Church of St. Mary the Virgin, Oxford University, England, as well as in various American churches. Her organ compositions can be heard on two CDs, *From Pen to Pipes* and *Pipes Rhode Island*. Dr. Sobaje recently completed a two-year term as Dean of the Rhode Island Chapter – American Guild of Organists.

Dr. Brian Taylor holds the Bachelor of Music degree from Westminster Choir College, the Master of Divinity degree from Austin Presbyterian Theological Seminary, the Master of Music and Master of Sacred Music degrees from Southern Methodist University and the Doctor of Sacred Music degree from the Graduate Theological Foundation. His organ teachers have included Vernon E. Smitley, Miriam Belleville, George Markey, Eugene Roan and Robert T. Anderson. Dr. Taylor currently serves as Organist-Choirmaster of St. John's Episcopal Church in Savannah, Georgia, where he conducts a Girls Choir, Men & Boys Choir and Mixed-voice Choir. The combined choirs have recorded two compact discs and undertaken week-long residencies at Truro Cathedral (UK) in 2003 and Lichfield Cathedral (UK) in 2007. Previously, Dr. Taylor served Episcopal, Congregational and Presbyterian parishes in Tennessee, Texas, Alabama, New Jersey and Michigan. He has given concerts in the United States, Canada and once in Brazil. Dr. Taylor has published two anthems with Sonare Publications as well as several articles. He is an active member of both the American Guild of Organists and the Association of Anglican Musicians.

Dr. Christoph Tietze began his organ studies at age 10 in his native Germany. He received a Bachelor of Arts degree in music from San Jose State University, Master of Music and Master of Musical Arts degrees from Yale University's Institute of Sacred Music, and the Doctor of Sacred Music from the Graduate Theological Foundation, completing his coursework at St. Benet's Hall, Oxford University, and Sarum College in Salisbury, England. Dr. Tietze has held music director positions at cathedrals on the East and West coasts for 23 years and is currently Music Director Organist at

St. Mary's Cathedral in San Francisco, California. He has lectured throughout the United States and Europe on Gregorian chant, the introits, children's choirs, improvisation, and the music of Karg-Elert, and his books on the introits are published by Liturgy Training Publications and World Library Publications.

Doctoral Defense Dates

- *Dissertation Proposal*
- *Abstract and Biographical Statement*
- *2 CD-ROM copies of the dissertation (PDF or MS Word format)*
- *3 unbound copies of the dissertation*
- *Ordinarius sign-off answering the 6 key points within the dissertation*

Oxford and Rome (Summer 2007)

Every year, many students choose to study in Oxford and Rome to take coursework toward their degrees at the Foundation. In Oxford, students attend the International Summer Programme in Theology at Christ Church College, Oxford, and in Rome, the Centro Pro Unione Ecumenical Theology Course. The topic for the 2008 Oxford program is "Faith and Knowledge." Oxford dates: July 20-August 1, 2008. Rome dates: June 22-July 11, 2008.

This year, thirty-six students of the Foundation attended the summer program in Oxford, led by the Programme Director, The Revd Canon Dr Jane Shaw, Fellow, Dean of Divinity and Chaplain at New College, Oxford, who also served as a tutor. She is also Honorary Canon of Christ Church Cathedral and, at the Foundation, Fellow and Evelyn Underhill Professor of Historical Theology. The theme of this year's program was "Exploring Theology in the 21st Century," and over 60 students (total) from around the world studied for either one or two weeks under sixteen distinguished tutors. Foundation students earned two Units of Study per week in attendance. Tutors included Canon Vincent Strudwick, Honorary Fellow of Kellogg College, Oxford, and Bishop John Tinsley Professor of Anglican Theology at the Foundation, and Fr. Robin Gibbons, Departmental Lecturer and Director of Theology and Religious Studies in the Oxford University Department for Continuing Education. Fr. Gibbons is both Dean of Studies, Foundation House/Oxford, and Alexander Schmemmann Professor of Eastern Christianity at the Foundation. He collaborated as an official Foundation representative with the Foundation Provost, Dr. Linda Morgan, and Director of Marketing and Publications, Ms. Kyna Morgan, who were in attendance during both weeks. An office was allocated to the Foundation on the campus of Christ Church College, Oxford, for students to be able to speak with the Foundation representatives about coursework, projects, dissertations and general issues.

In Rome, five Foundation students studied in the intimate setting of the Centro Pro Unione in the Ecumenical Theology course, lasting three weeks. The theme of the course was "Introduction to the Ecumenical & Interreligious Movements from a Roman Catholic Perspective." The program is directed by Fr. James Puglisi, SA, Director of

the Centro Pro Unione, and Francis Joseph Cardinal Spellman Professor of Catholic Theology at the Foundation. Students attend morning sessions followed by excursions and lectures in the afternoons. Per week in attendance at the Centro, students of the Foundation earn one Unit of Study (three in total) toward their degrees.

Both Oxford University Department for Continuing Education and the Centro Pro Unione are Recognized and Endorsed by the Graduate Theological Foundation. New Bachelor's Degree in Media Studies

Cloverdale College, undergraduate division of the Graduate Theological Foundation, is pleased to announce the inauguration of the Bachelor of Fine Arts in Media Studies (B.F.A.). This degree is designed for the professional working in various media with a ministry focus, including film, television, radio, internet, or interactive/multimedia. Two tracks of study are available to students in this degree program: 1) Film/TV/Radio, and 2) Interactive Media/Multimedia. Students must complete the core curriculum and may choose to specialize in one of the above two tracks depending on their professional experience and interest. The Bachelor of Fine Arts in Media Studies is a degree-completion program which requires a high school diploma/G.E.D. and five years of professional experience prior to admission. Graduation requirements include the completion of courses totaling 240 clock hours of instruction that may be chosen from a variety of venues. The time frame for completion of this degree is 12-24 months. Applications are accepted throughout the year.

Students completing the B.F.A. are eligible to enter the Master of Fine Arts in Media Studies (M.F.A.) offered through the Graduate Theological Foundation. Tracks in the M.F.A. are 1) Journalism & Religious Issues, 2) Visual Media & Social Values, and 3) Applied Media Studies, with an option to enroll in the dual Master of Fine Arts/Master of Business Administration (M.F.A./M.B.A.) program designed for professionals in management (media/entertainment/communication). The Orson Welles Memorial Scholarship in Media Studies is available to students choosing this option.

Bachelor of Sacred Music Introduced

The new degree of Bachelor of Sacred Music (B.S.M.) is offered by Cloverdale College, undergraduate division of the Graduate Theological Foundation. This degree has been designed for those students wishing to earn a formal degree and who have professional experience in the field of sacred music. Students taking the B.S.M. from the College will qualify for admission to the Graduate Theological Foundation's Master of Sacred Music (M.S.M.) degree program

The College's Bachelor of Sacred Music is a degree-completion program requiring a high school diploma/G.E.D. and five years of professional experience for admission. Applications are accepted throughout the year. Graduation requirements include the submission of 52 performance bulletins from regular worship services and copies of 2 bulletins and audio recordings of special performances such as Easter and Christmas services. Most students complete this degree-completion program in twelve months, but twenty-four months is allowed for completion of the Bachelor of Sacred Music degree.

Website Additions

The Foundation's website is continually expanding to be made as user-friendly as possible for students, alumni/ae, affiliated bodies and other interested persons. During the past year, the Foundation has posted an Online Alumni/ae and Current Student Roster, a complete listing of all successfully defended doctoral dissertations, a list of the alma mater institutions of recent graduates (2005-present), and a list of Spanish Language venues for students wishing to complete their coursework in the Spanish language.

Online Roster The Online Roster was created to facilitate networking among students and graduates. This roster contains information such as name, location (state/country), degree program, and email address, if available. The Foundation urges students and alumni/ae to utilize this resource for purposes of sharing research and information of state licensure, for example. Access to this roster is strictly limited and is only available through a username and password, the username being the Student ID granted upon acceptance into a Foundation degree program. For those current students and alumni/ae who do not have a Student ID, an email request may be sent to the Office of Student Services at studentservices@gtfeducation.org. The Online Roster login page may be found by visiting www.gtfeducation.org, and clicking on Student Resources, and then Online Roster.

Dissertations List Another addition to the website is a complete listing of all Doctor of Philosophy and Doctor of Theology dissertations successfully defended before Foundation faculty. Dissertations are grouped in the general topic

areas of Church History, Hispanic Studies, Islamic Studies, Pastoral Care, Music and Liturgy, Scriptures, and Theology. The author's name, degree, and year of defense are also listed. The Dissertations List is found on the homepage of the Foundation; click Academics, then Dissertations. From this page, the Dissertations On Disc (DOD) Library may also be accessed, which makes available a wide range of dissertations from the Foundation. The titles listed on the DOD page are available for order from the Foundation; formats (PDF or MS Word) are indicated next to the titles.

Alma Maters of Graduates In an effort to determine the alma mater institutions of recent graduates, the Foundation has gathered this information and posted it online. Through the Student Body page on the website, a list of the alma maters of graduates from 2005-present may be viewed. More than 15 foreign countries are represented, including such nations as Nigeria, El Salvador, Belgium, Mexico, Saudi Arabia, and the Philippines. The Foundation consistently attracts highly trained and accomplished students, many from the most recognized theological institutions in the United States and abroad.

Faculty Notes

The Revd Dr. Robin Gibbons, Alexander Schmemmann Professor of Eastern Christianity, has a new book entitled *House of God: House of the People of God: A study of Christian Liturgical Space*, which is published by SPCK (Society for Promoting Christian Knowledge). Dr. Gibbons' book is available online from the SPCK website at www.spck.org.uk. From the book description: "Robin Gibbons has spent many years examining the church building from not only an architectural but also a liturgical standpoint. In this richly researched book, he has put together a theology of Christian space and place. He discusses the tension between the two roles of the house of God – as a sacred space for meeting with the Divine and a place of vibrant community for God's people. He argues that the balance between these two aspects of a church building can be fertile ground for new growth, if well understood." Dr. Gibbons' book *House of God* is archived at the Foundation. Dr. Ann Graber, Professor of Logotherapy/Existential Analysis, was the recipient of the Presidential Award during the 16th World Congress on Viktor Frankl's Logotherapy, June 2007, in Dallas, Texas. The award was presented for visionary leadership, unselfish service, and distinguished contributions in promoting the work of Viktor E. Frankl throughout the world. The Institute has P.R.I.M.E. status with the Foundation. The Foundation accepts the Diplomate in Logotherapy, earned through the Institute, toward the D.Min., Psy.D., and Ph.D. degrees in Franklian Psychology. Dr. Graber offers an E-Tutorial through the Foundation entitled "Victor Frankl's Logotherapy: Method of Choice in Pastoral Psychology."

The Rev. Dr. Peter Roussakis, Charles Wesley Professor of Sacred Music, was invited this year by Dr. Timothy Hein (D.S.M. 2006), Minister of Music and the Arts at Shandon Memorial United Methodist Church in Columbia, South Carolina, to be a part of his church's Festival in November 2007 celebrating the 300th anniversary of Charles Wesley's birth. Dr. Roussakis will be speaking on the subject of "The Theological Themes of Charles Wesley's Hymns."

Dr. Ekman P. C. Tam, Professor of Spirituality and Psychotherapy, published a book entitled *A*

Psycho-spiritual Approach to Christian Spiritual Direction Based on the Stair Model of Therapy.
